

**CAMPUS SAFETY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES**

**OPEN COMMENT PERIOD**

Chair Holman acknowledged Chair Baumgartner on the publication of his newest book, *Suspect Citizens*, and its appearance on CNN.

Member Maya Weinstein addressed the Commission and announced her last meeting as a member due to her graduating from UNC School of Law. She thanked the Commission for their determination in carrying out its charge, and urged the Commission to continue vocalizing its support for students in the community when there are particularly egregious acts of violence, as they cannot be ignored.

The Commission thanked Maya for her time on the Commission and wished her the best for her future endeavors.

**CHANCELLOR KEVIN M. GUSKIEWICZ**

Chancellor Guskiewicz began his address by acknowledging the current racial climate and inequities faced by the Black community nationally. He thanked members of the Commission for their diligent service to the Commission, and thanked Maya for her dedication to public service during her time at UNC-CH.

Chancellor Guskiewicz shared that Chair Baumgartner would be taking a temporary leave from the Commission, and Jim Herrington has graciously agreed to service in his place as co-chair.

Jim Herrington thanked the Chancellor for the invitation to serve as acting co-chair and emphasized the need for the Commission to continue to pursue greater representation in the space of the Commission body. To this point, Kim Strom noted the need to be cognizant of the times, which demands that the Commission advocate for students, faculty and staff.

Maya Weinstein noted for the Commission that a new Title IX Task Force has been convened for addressing sexual violence – this needs to be followed and shared with the Commission as a priority, as the findings of this task force will impact students in different ways.

Following the conclusion of the Commission’s conversation with Chancellor Guskiewicz, Chair Baumgartner thanked Chancellor Guskiewicz for prioritizing the work of the Commission and being sincere about the actions put forth as a Commission.

### **COVID-19 UPDATE, UNC OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

Derek Kemp presented updates to the Commission alongside Cathy Brennan, Chief David Perry, and Desirée Rieckenberg. Key topics discussed included:

- the encouragement of individual responsibility of students to execute physical distancing, mask wearing, etc.,
- the EOC’s constant monitoring of CDC guidance and the University’s preparations to remain flexible to this guidance,
- the importance of UNC Police played a peripheral role in the enforcement on mask-wearing, placing the oneness on managers and supervisors to exercise their leadership to encourage safe practices,
- the current efforts to establish testing and antibody testing protocols and the conditions that trigger these protocols,
- and the importance of protecting staff members who are at greater risk of infection (dining services, cleaning services, facilities services, etc.).

### **MOTION TO APPROVE STATEMENT**

On motion of Maya Weinstein and second from Branny Vickory, the Commission voted to approve a statement addressing the current racial climate within the United States.
